6. Discerning Technology Use:

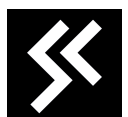

9. Responsible Stewardship:

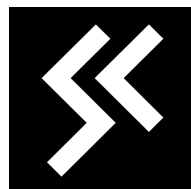
- Scripture: 1 Peter 4:10 - "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."
